

John 13:34-35 & 17:21-22



Galatians 5:22-23 tells us, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law."

The second fruit of the Spirit is joy. The word 'joy' appears nearly 200 times in the Bible, which helps us understand just how important this second sweet fruit of the Spirit really is. Joy is a condition of the heart.

In Greek, the word for joy is 'chara.' This describes a feeling of inner delight or rejoicing. This inner rejoicing leads to a cheerful heart which reflects in cheerful behavior.

Quite often joy is confused with happiness, but they are not one in the same, nor are they interchangeable. You can be happy, but not joyous. What I mean by this is simple, joy comes from the Lord, and is rooted in who God is. You could possibly be going through the worse situation of your life and of course you would not be happy about it, but you could, would and should still have joy. James 1: 2, 3 tells us, "Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance".

Happiness on the other hand is emotional and depends on what is going on right now. It is fleeting... you get a new car or your stimulus check comes (lol). It makes you happy, but when the car is old or the stimulus is spent, what then...to have joy is to have a heart of gratitude and walk in it regardless life's circumstances.

The most important thing to remember about joy is that you can indeed have joy in the midst of adversity. I know that this is not natural and goes against our flesh. Our flesh and our humanity wants to sulk and be sad when we are going through hard times, but we have to remember that earth has no sorrows that heaven cannot heal. We must always remind ourselves that God is the only one who is truly in control of everything that concerns us. He is omniscient (he knows everything) and omnipresent (he is everywhere at the same time). He knows our end before our beginning, Jer. 29:11 tells us, "For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the LORD, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end."

It is alright to not always be happy, but we can still have joy if we recall the Word of God and remind ourselves that "the joy of the Lord is our strength" (Neh. 8:10), and that weeping may endure for a night, but joy comes in the morning" (Ps. 30:5).

Song writer Donald Lawrence said it well when he penned this (sing it along with me)...sometimes you have to speak over yourself, sometimes you have to speak victory during the test. No matter how you feel, speak the Word and you will be healed. Speak over yourself, encourage yourself, in the Lord!

In closing: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope" (Romans 15:13).

Most women still want to someday become a wife and a mother to the point that sometimes our happiness and fulfillment depend upon it to the point where we can put our lives on hold until our Prince Charming arrives.

In this day and age it is common in most U.S. States that woman outnumber men - for example in the state of Maryland with an estimated population of 5,976,407 (2,896,418 male/3,079,989 female) – a gender ratio of 94/100. When you consider marriage age males who are saved, single, not incarcerated and are heterosexual, for Christian women, perception appears that pickings are slim. But let's not forget our God still provides.

Let's look at the Book of Ruth:

Ruth was a young woman of Moab, the great-grandmother of David and an ancestress of Jesus. Her story was set in the time of Judges during a temporary time of peace between Israel and Moab. Ruth married outside of her race to the son of Elimelech and Naomi, Ephrathites from Bethlehem, Judah. Eventually Ruth's husband, father-in-law & brother-in-law died leaving her, her mother-in-law and sister-in-law destitute. Naomi told her daughters by marriage to go back to their families and the possibility of remarriage because she was going back home to her country. Oprah quickly chose that option while Ruth chose to stay with Naomi. Now we can't really blame Oprah for bailing on the family, because in those days without a husband, life for a woman was pretty much as bad as it gets. So why did Ruth decide to stay? 1) She loved and was very protective of her mother-in-law, 2) Her marriage to a Jew from a different race was not just a life changing event it was a spiritual change of heart - she accepted her new family's God and going back to her life before marriage was no longer an option for her. So they headed back to Bethlehem where Ruth immediately got busy providing for her and her Mom-in-Love working in the fields of a man named Boaz. Keep in mind Ruth wasn't looking for another husband, her focus was on surviving. Her character of being a hard worker, humble and righteous was not only quickly noticed by the harvest foreman but also by the field owner, Boaz, who offered her food and suggested she stay working in his fields for her safety. When Ruth told Naomi about her day and how she'd been treated, Naomi realizing that Boaz was a close relative went to work doing some matchmaking. What I liked about Boaz was that he treated Ruth, a foreigner with respect, dignity and protected her virtue, reputation and he went through the established process at that time to make marriage to her a reality. He also welcomed Naomi (Ruth's 1st husband's Mom) into his household.

So what I see in this story is that Boaz was open to marriage and in finding a Godly wife before the idea even occurred to Ruth. Naomi, who loved Ruth, objectively saw qualities in Boaz that would be of benefit to her daughter-in-law – so Ruth's feelings were not the primary measurement to the true character of Boaz. The Book of Ruth did not once mention what Ruth looked like, the focus was solely on her character. Most importantly, you can see God's hand in their courtship and all the events orchestrated from their initial meeting to their marriage. God provided for both Ruth and Naomi.

So let's roll the calendar up to today – what does this story have to do with today's Single Sister who has lost all hope that her Boaz will ever show up? All women whether married or not need to place God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit first in their hearts. Being a Godly wife is more than a notion and being married, even to a Godly husband, will require levels of forgiveness, selflessness and grace and will be the hardest commitment you will ever have to honor. No husband can ever do for you what God can and no husband will ever be worthy of you until God has prepared both of you for a Godly marriage. So instead of unhappily waiting for your Boaz - how about shifting your focus on establishing and strengthening your relationship with God, studying the Word, serving in ministry, stepping into your Godly purpose and being used by God freely in your singleness. Instead of looking and waiting for a husband, which God never intended you to do – *Jeremiah 29:22* “For I know the plans I have for you,” declares the LORD, “plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.” Live each day as if it were a personal gift to you from God, which it is. If you want a Godly

husband, keep praying for one – but – in the meantime - stop unhappily waiting and live, if you want to travel - travel, if you want to own property – You Go Girl! Buy yourself a home, if you want to become a Mom – adopt, become a foster Mom there are thousands of children needing a Mom just like you to love. Single sisters be encouraged because you are blessed, loved dearly by the God of the universe and are you highly favored! Believe that you have the power to create a life of fulfillment, purpose, love, laughter and blessing whether there is a Boaz in your future or not.

In doing research for this article I found this listing of “21 Qualities of a Good Husband in the Bible.” I have to admit it aptly describes a “Boaz,” but if most of us Married Sisters went by this list, Grrrrrrrr! We’d still be single! However, I do think that the following is a good point of reference from a Biblical perspective when considering marriage.

21 Qualities of a Good Husband in the Bible

1. **Independence** - “But from the beginning of the creation, God made them male and female. For this cause shall a man leave his father and mother, and cleave to his wife;” – Mark 10:6-7 KJV
2. **Affection** - “Let the husband render to his wife the affection due her, and likewise also the wife to her husband. – 1 Corinthians 7:3 NKJV
3. **Loyalty and Commitment** - “The wife does not have authority over her own body but yields it to her husband. In the same way, the husband does not have authority over his own body but yields it to his wife.” 1 Corinthians 7:4 NIV
4. **Leadership** - “Wives, submit yourselves unto your own husbands, as unto the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife, even as Christ is the head of the church: and he is the Savior of the body.” – Ephesians 5:22-23 KJV
5. **Self-Love** - “So ought men to love their wives as their own bodies. He that loveth his wife loveth himself.” – Ephesians 5:28 KJV
6. **Trust and Confidence** - “Who can find a virtuous woman? for her price is far above rubies. The heart of her husband doth safely trust in her, so that he shall have no need of spoil.” – Proverbs 31:10-11 KJV
7. **Appreciation** - “Her children arise up, and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praiseth her.” – Proverbs 31:28 KJV
8. **Godliness** - “And I will betroth you to me forever. I will betroth you to me in righteousness and in justice, in steadfast love and in mercy. I will betroth you to me in faithfulness. And you shall know the Lord.” – Hosea 2:19-20 ESV
9. **Spirituality** - “But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law.” – Galatians 5:22-23 KJV
10. **Honesty** - “Lying lips are an abomination to the Lord: but they that deal truly are his delight.” – Proverbs 12:22 KJV
11. **Forgiveness** - “Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye.” – Colossians 3:13 KJV
12. **Righteousness** - “The LORD’s curse is on the house of the wicked, but he blesses the home of the righteous.” – Proverbs 3:33 NIV
13. **Contentment** - “Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor’s house, thou shalt not covet thy neighbor’s wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his ox, nor his ass, nor anything that is thy neighbor’s.” – Exodus 20:17 KJV
14. **Courage** - “There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not been perfected in love.” – 1 John 4:18 ESV
15. **Patience** - “Make no friendship with an angry man; and with a furious man, thou shalt not go: Lest thou learn his ways, and get a snare to thy soul. – Proverbs 22:24-25 KJV
16. **Good Influence** - “Do not be deceived: “Evil company corrupts good habits.” – 1 Corinthians 15:33 NKJV
17. **Self-Control** - “Do not mix with winebibbers, Or with gluttonous eaters of meat; For the drunkard and the glutton will come to poverty, And drowsiness will clothe a man with rags.” – Proverbs 23:20-21 NKJV
18. **Fidelity** - “Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, Thou shalt not commit adultery: But I say unto you, That whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart.” – Matthew 5:27-28 KJV
19. **Wisdom** - “He that walketh with wise men shall be wise: but a companion of fools shall be destroyed.” – Proverbs 13:20 KJV
20. **Altruism** - “Husbands, love your wives, and be not bitter against them.” – Colossians 3:19 KJV
21. **True love** - “Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good.” – Romans 12:9 ESV

John 4:34-38 “My food,” said Jesus, “is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work. Don’t you have a saying, ‘It’s still four months until harvest’? I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest. Even now the one who reaps draws a wage and harvests a crop for eternal life, so that the sower and the reaper may be glad together. Thus the saying ‘One sows and another reaps’ is true. I sent you to reap what you have not worked for. Others have done the hard work, and you have reaped the benefits of their labor.”

Think about everything that contributed to the story of how you came to know Christ as your Lord and Savior. It's probably not possible to fully count all those spiritual seeds that God used to draw you to Him. And not all the people who sowed good seed into your life knew what the outcome would be. We also have the opportunity and privilege - every single day - of sowing seeds into the lives of others, such as our friends, co-workers, children, grandchildren, or even strangers. For in seven days I will send rain on the earth forty days and forty nights, and every living thing that I have made I will blot out from the face of the ground.” [Genesis 7:4](#)



Not one. Those who have been reckless with their lives are usually reckless with their deaths. While the end of life should be sobering, spiritually, it is not. What causes such blindness? Deception. What should I do if someone I love is approaching the latter years of their life and there is no sign that they will turn to Christ, their ark of safety? I should concede that I cannot argue them into the kingdom. Though some love the sport of debate, no one embraces Christ through apologetic wrangling. The only tool I should have in my hands that will break the heart of stone is the Word of God. "Is not my word like fire, declares the LORD, and like a hammer that breaks the rock in pieces?" [Jeremiah 23:29](#) The Spirit of God, in scripture, is what breaks through the wall of unbelief. I hold it in my hands, look at it for what it is, tremble, and ask God to direct me to the right scriptures to pray over the unbeliever. I stand my ground for the long haul. I put their name in the scriptures I'm led to. I pray them, recite them, and share them with the person directly. Each time I do, if that person is destined to believe, the Word will have its effect. Like strategically placed dynamite, it will slowly implode the crusty exterior of a sin-affected, deceived, hardened heart. **When am I going to really understand the power of Your Word? When I finally get it, I will turn to it first as my only resource. Amen.**

Homemade Orange Chicken


Ingredients:

- 5 cups precooked cubed chicken breast (staled)
- 3 eggs
- 1/3 cup flour
- 1/3 cup corn starch
- 2 cups oil (for frying)
- 1 1/2 cup freshly squeezed orange juice
- 1/2 cup honey (preferably raw honey)
- 2 tablespoons rice vinegar
- 2 tablespoons soy sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon fresh ginger (shredded)
- 5 garlic cloves, finely diced
- 1/2 teaspoon chili flakes
- zest from 1 orange
- 1 1/2 tablespoon cornstarch and pinch of salt

Directions:

- In a medium pot, add orange juice, honey, vinegar, soy sauce, ginger, garlic, and red chili flakes. Heat for few minutes.
- In separate dish, whisk 1 1/2 tablespoon of cornstarch with 2 1/2 tablespoons of water to form a paste.
- Add to orange sauce and whisk together. Continue to cook for 5 minutes, until the mixture begins to thicken. Once the sauce is thickened, remove from heat and add orange zest. Set aside.
- Place flour and cornstarch in a mixing bowl, add a pinch of salt and mix.
- Whisk eggs and pinch of salt in a separate dish.
- Dip chicken pieces in egg mixture and then flour mixture. Place on plate.
- Heat oil in a heavy-bottomed pot over medium-high heat. Make sure you have at least 2-3 inch of oil in the pot.
- Cook for 1-2 min. turning often until golden brown. Toss chicken with orange sauce.
- Sprinkle with chopped green onions, roasted sesame seeds and orange zest before serving.
